

TRAVELING

I was just up at Lake Tahoe, but not for the skiing. I had no inclination to slide down steep, snow covered mountains. We get together as a family at Christmas and some members of my family like to ski and Tahoe seemed to a number of these kin to be just the place to gather. After all the wildfires, it was splendid to see all the white and to shiver in the cold.

Because of my shoulder surgery, I missed out on my vacation last Summer and so have been preoccupied with figuring out where I might go next.

Returning to where I have already gone is tempting; you know what it's like and what to expect. I love Italy and even lived there four years early in my priestly life. My "restaurant" Italian is still pretty good. I wouldn't mind casting my eyes on what has dazzled me before, but the world is very big and each Sunday when I read the travel section of the newspaper, I see a new place that looks attractive. I have never been to Scandinavia; I could go to Stockholm to see where I would go when I win the Nobel prize for peace. It pays to be prepared.

Some journeys are less about where you go and more about the travel itself. Jack Kerouac wrote whole books about long road trips he took; I recommend, "On the Road" and "Dharma Bums." Some

people love cruises precisely because, once you get unpacked, you don't have to fuss with your bags until the end of the trip. You can sit all day long reading or looking out the window.

Every place has its own culture. I used to study with some Scottish priests, but I had a hard time figuring out what they were saying, so thick were their accents. At times I wasn't sure whether they were speaking English or some local dialect. People have told me that the French look down on you if you can't speak their lan-

guage, but I have never found that to be the case; rather I have always been treated very well.

I was annoyed when first I lived in Rome because you had to go to a different shop for every item on your list, a little store to buy your liquor and wine, another for pasta, another for tobacco products (where you could also buy stamps for some reason.) There was even a shop that just sold men's socks. Why didn't they have a Target or Kmart where *everything* was

handy in one place? After I had lived there a year or two, I figured it out: in their way of shopping you got to know the shop owners by name and they knew you by name; I bought my vegetables from one particular woman; she knew I always bought lemons from her and called me over to her side of the bin one day and pulled out of a cardboard box the last bunch of lemons that she had set aside just for me.

For convenience, there's nothing to match a package tour, but I prefer to go out myself to look at the menus to decide where I might eat tonight and to observe what people are doing on the street. Are they in a hurry to get home or out for a stroll? A character in one of Marilynne Robinson's novels tells his son, "Wherever you turn your eyes the

world can shine like transfiguration. You don't have to bring a thing to it except a little willingness to see." This is as true of home as it is of distant shores, but every now and again, it sure peaks the curiosity of a person to be away from home. Saint Augustine said, "The world is a book, and those who do not travel read only a page."

WeShare uses SSL to ensure that your personal and sensitive data is transmitted safely. 7) Your funds are protected and automatically transferred to our parish. 8) The automatic record keeping insures fewer human errors. 9) You may combine using traditional methods of
