IMAGINING SAINT ANNE

You won't find Saint Anne in the gospels, but she makes her appearance in the 2nd century "First Gospel of James" and in the 3rd century "Gospel of the Nativity of Mary," both apocryphal writings. In their devotion for Mary, believers tried to imagine what *her* mother may have been like. Her name gives us the first clue; it means grace. Then, of course, she must have been married; her husband's name came to be known as Joachim which means "he whom Yahweh has set up."

Although the couple had a comfortable and devout life in Nazareth, they were childless. When Joachim went to the Temple to offer sacrifice one day, a certain Reuben stopped him on the pretext that men without offspring were unworthy to be admitted. In grief and shame he ran away to the mountains. When Anne found out why her husband had not returned, she made her own plea to God, promising, if the Lord would take away her curse of sterility, she would dedicate her child to the service of the Lord.

Their prayers were heard; an angel came to Anne with the message, "The Lord has looked upon your tears; you will conceive and give birth and the fruit of your womb will be blessed by all the world." The angel brought a similar message to Joachim who then returned home. When a daughter was born, she was named Mary.

Surely every child is loved by his or her parents; new mothers, in particular, fairly glow. But imagine how

supremely delighted Joachim and Anne would have been after so long of time without a child. Often in art, Saint Anne is depicted as seated with her child, Mary, playing on her lap. It would have been Saint Anne's responsibility to teach her daughter how to live, how to cook and clean, how to wash and dry the laundry, how to pray and, most importantly, how to dedicate her life to God. She would have taught her daughter how to love God and her neighbor as herself. We can see how well Anne performed that last duty when, later, the angel Gabriel comes to her daughter and asks her to be the mother of our Savior. Mary does not hesitate but replies, "Behold, I am the

handmaid of the Lord. Let it be done unto me according to your word."

Through the centuries devotion to Saint Anne has remained strong, first starting in the eastern churches and then in the west. And, for nearly a century, here in Seal Beach.

On the cover of this week's bulletin we have Leonardo da Vinci's beautiful and moving take on mother, daughter and grandchild. It is the most beautiful image of Saint Anne I have ever seen. The original oil painting can be seen in the Louvre in Paris. But the crusader church dedicated to Saint Anne in Jerusalem, seen on this page, is also quite stunning

in its simplicity; be sure to see it if you get the chance to visit the Holy Land.

CHRISM MASS

This year's Chrism Mass will be held at the Arboretum at Christ Cathedral at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, March 26th. All the faithful are invited to participate in this Mass to witness the blessing of the Oil and the consecration of Holy Chrism.



Priests serving in our diocese concelebrate this Mass, during which they also renew their commitment to priestly service. Oils to be used in the coming year are presented for the bishop's blessing. These include the oil for the sick, used in anointing the sick; the oil for catechumens, used during baptism; and the oil for the sacred chrism, which is the primary anointing oil. It is used in the sacraments of initiation and holy orders as well as special acts of dedication. The word "chrism" means "consecrated oil."
