PURGATORY

I have never been very clear about what purgatory will be like. Unlike hell, it is temporary; you do get out of there when your sentence is up. Unlike heaven, the weather is so lousy there (think, sweat lodge) you suffer until you "achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven," according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church. It is all about purification.

Dante describes it as a mountain "of such sort that climbing it is hardest at the start; but as we rise, the slope grows less unkind." I hope he is right about that.

If my recent experience is any indication I believe that purgatory is more like modern medical treatment. A lot of time is taken in making and traveling to appointments with doctors, who then send you to various clinics for tests (a little blood to check for this and that, an x ray to check out the lungs, an EKG to see what's happening in the chambers of the heart,

etc.) At each step, your blood pressure is taken; it is a wonder that your upper arm doesn't turn black-and-blue. If you are lucky, new appointments are made for you to sit down with the doc to review the results of the tests but occasionally these tests must be repeated when the doc is not happy with the results. Or if you are really not so lucky, you end up in the hospital.

Did I mention that a patient rarely gets to speak directly to the people who set these

appointments? The front desk asks you how they can direct your call. You mention a name or an extension number and you are switched to that particular phone. The person you are contacting is "away from her desk or on another call," so you leave a message with your name, phone number and date-of-birth. They promise to get back to you within 24 hours;

most of the time they do at exactly the moment when it is least convenient for you.

There is always the question of payment: \$30 copay for each visit and then wrangling with the insurance company to make sure the other costs are covered, particularly medications, that sometimes are quite expensive.

The strongest image of this purgatory is the waiting rooms at the doctors' offices. I always bring a book, because you can't be sure how long you will be sitting there. You feel like you won the lottery when the nurse opens the door and calls out your name. (Maybe in the future I should tip her, so she takes good care of me the next time I am in that office.)

When you meet finally with the doctor, the best you can hope for is to be told you are doing well

and to come back in a few months for your next checkup. You are sometimes sent off to another doctor who specializes in whatever seems to be wrong with you.

The Catechism says that purgatory is a "final purification" for those who "fall asleep in God's grace and friendship." I am convinced that we experience a lot of our purification while still on earth. The challenge is to not complain about it. Nobody wants a whiner around. Heaven will be like a tropical resort, I imagine, but before we

get there, we have plenty of difficult work for us to do both here and then, after death, when we find ourselves sweating in purgatory.
