SCHOOL

Soon enough many of our younger parishioners will be going back to school. Maybe some of them are already giving some thought to what they will

write down when on the first day the new teacher assigns that inevitable essay, "How I Spent My Summer Vacation." Will I write about the trips we took as a family to visit relatives? Or to National Parks? Will I include the surfing lessons? I might include the wedding of my cousin in

Ontario because it was so much fun. And there was a week at scout camp learning how to make a fire without matches and the rules for safety around water. For all the times I complained to my mom that I was bored, I sure did a lot of things this Summer.

Getting back into sitting in a desk and listening quietly will be hard, especially on the teachers who must insist on that discipline because they know that little learning can take place in a chaotic classroom. Soon students will have to open their textbooks to a certain page and fill out the pages of their workbooks. Teachers will pass handouts to them; they will squirm while trying to remember the right answers to the questions on tests and pop quizzes. *I knew the answer to that last June but that was months ago.* They will have to slow down and read the questions carefully to make sure they know what is being asked for. The classes can feel so long, and recess is always too short. Then after school there's the grind of homework to complete. (I disliked that so much I put it off and got up early the next morning to do it just before leaving for school.)



This weekend some students are already looking forward: *I wonder what kind of math we'll be studying this year. I hope the new teacher is nice. Will there be any field trips this year? Maybe we'll have new students joining our class. Who knows? There may be a new subject that will be really interesting. Some friends may have been gone all summer and it will be fun to see them again and hear about their adventures.*

Here too we will school our students; we will do it in the ways of Christ and the Church. Some will be preparing for their First Communions—which grandparents find particularly attractive—and older students will be deepening their faith in preparation for their reception of the sacrament of Confirmation; this includes retreats which often touch them deeply. Parents and godparents will have to attend class in preparation for their child's baptism. New altar servers will have to learn the ropes. The choir will be warming up their voices to learn new songs and chants. The Women's Guild will have a slate of speakers; even the Knights will be hearing from those who remind them of their religious responsibilities or give them ideas on how to be better parents and grandparents.

In heaven learning will be a breeze; I'm thinking you might not even have to crack a book. But here on earth learning requires attention, comprehension, memory, rote, questions that have to be answered just so and the practice that makes perfect. It's work even when it is a labor of love. And everybody has to do it, not just those enrolled officially in a school. Sorry, Summer is over. Get to work! Msgr. Mike


Saint Anne Church exists to help us become disciples of Jesus Christ who connect with God, grow in faith, and serve in love.

JOURNEY OF HOPE



SACRAMENTS

In order to celebrate the following Sacraments at St. Anne,
it is vital to be an active member of our Faith Community.

Baptism: Contact the Parish Office to arrange for baptism.

Baptisms are usually celebrated the first Saturday of the
month at 11:00 a.m. Baptism preparation classes for
parents and Godparents are held once a month on a
Tuesday night at 7:00 p.m.

PreK-8 Faith Formation: For information and/or
enrollment in faith formation programs, please contact

Confirmation: Students typically begin the Confirmation
process as a freshman in high school and complete the
process at the end of their sophomore year.

Marriage: An appointment with one of our priests to
begin marriage preparation must be made at least 6
months before the wedding celebration.

Pastoral Care: If you, or someone you know, wishes to
have their name placed on our prayer net, or a visit and/or
