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## DRINK

I am taken by the fact that, in John's Gospel, the first miracle Jesus performs is turning water into wine at a wedding reception he was attending with his disciples. He did it because his mother wanted him to. And the best part: his wine was really good, causing the headwaiter to comment to the groom, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then, when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Pope Francis, perhaps with this scripture in mind, said, "But imagine finishing a wedding party drinking tea - it would be shameful! Wine is necessary for the celebration."

Saint Paul may have written to the Romans: "The Kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking, but of justice, peace, and the joy that is given by the Holy Spirit." I am all for the joy that is given by the Holy Spirit but there is also an earthly joy in drinking a good wine or a beer, or, my personal favorite: a scotch. I see no reason why we can't enjoy lots of different joys.

An anonymous poet in the tenth or eleventh century wrote, "I would like to have the men of heaven in my own house with vats of good cheer laid out for them. I would like a great lake of beer for the King of Kings. I would like to be watching heaven's family drinking it for all eternity." Now there is a new image of heaven, a giant pub with everyone toasting the King of Kings.

Like the rest of society, the church has always had makers and consumers of alcohol. The most famous of the winemakers was Dom Pérignon, a Benedictine monk of the Abbey of Hautvillers in France. He pioneered techniques to improve wines that are still used today, including a second fermentation in Springtime which gave his wine their bubbles, what we call champagne. One day, when he tasted a particularly excellent bottle of champagne, he shouted out, "Brothers, come quickly. I am drinking stars!"

Wine, Saint Thomas Aquinas said, could lawfully be drunk *usque ad hilaritatem*, to the point of cheerfulness.

I admit there are fewer references to scotch over the ages. Jesus never visited Scotland and, besides, even if he did, it hadn't yet been invented. The Scotch Whiskey Society reports that the earliest record of distillation in Scotland occurred as long ago as 1494. Scotch whiskey evolved from a drink called *uisge beatha*, which

means "water of life." Some of the older priests I knew when I was newly ordained referred to scotch as "Holy Water," as in, "Mike, could you do me a favor and bring me a little more holy water?"

The famous writers, William Kennedy and Gabriel Garcia Marquez, met one day and had been "drinking Scotch carefully for about five hours, lost in small talk and the free-form interchange of two languages," English and Spanish. There was someone with them who could translate for them but sometime during their conversation Garcia started popping English phrases at Kennedy and Kennedy declared that he was "fluently pidgin in Spanish. There was no comprehension problem," Kennedy said. "We praised the liberating effect of whiskey."

Here are some drinking prayers. The first two are in the Roman Ritual. I bet you can guess where the last one came from.

### WINE

Lord, Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, who in Cana of Galilee changed water into wine, be pleased to bless and to hallow this creature, wine, which you have given as refreshment for your servants. And grant that whenever it is taken as drink or poured into wounds it will be accompanied by an outpouring of grace from on high.

### BEER

O Lord, bless this creature beer, which by Your kindness and power has been produced from kernels of grain, and may it be a health-giving drink for all humanity.

### SCOTCH

Lord Jesus, you told us when two or three gather in your name, you are present. Join us now as we pour our drinks. Be with us in our conversations and our reminiscences. Hear our questions and our doubts. Let not the scotch lead us to tell untruths or to boast of capacities we do not actually possess. Keep us humble and honest. Be patient with us when we enthusiastically work to solve all the world's thorniest problems; remind us that you have already redeemed the world. Let there be moments when we shut up and silently share our bonds of friendship. And, yes, thanks also for the gift of ice. Amen.



## SACRAMENTS

In order to celebrate the following Sacraments at St. Anne, it is vital to be an active member of our Faith Community.

**Baptism:** Contact the Parish Office to arrange for baptism.

Baptisms are usually celebrated the first Saturday of the month at 11:00 a.m. Baptism preparation classes for parents and Godparents are held once a month on a Tuesday night at 7:00 p.m.

**Confirmation:** Students typically begin the Confirmation process as a freshman in high school and complete the process at the end of their sophomore year.

**Marriage:** An appointment with one of our priests to begin marriage preparation must be made at least 6 months before the wedding celebration.

**Funeral:** Contact the parish office to arrange funerals.

**Pastoral Care:** If you, or someone you know, wishes to have their name placed on our prayer net, or a visit and/or Holy Communion, please contact the Parish Office.

**Sacrament of the Sick:** In case of serious illness, contact the parish office.
