LOOK AT YOUR FISH

ouis Agassiz, a nineteenth-century Harvard naturalist, would give the same test to every new student. Taking a smelly old fish out of a jar and placing it in a tin pan, he would tell the student, "Look at your fish." Then he would leave. When he came back, he would ask the student what he'd seen. Not very much, they would most often answer, and Agassiz would say it again: "Look at your fish." It is said that this could go on for days; his students came to call it "the ordeal with the fish."

The professor would encourage the student to draw the fish but not to use any tools for the examination, just hands and eyes. After several days, one such student, Samuel Scudder, who would later become a famous entomologist and expert on grasshoppers, still could not see whatever it was Agassiz wanted him to see. But, he said, "I see how little I saw before." Then Scudder had a brainstorm and he announced it to Agassiz the next morning: "Paired organs, the same on both sides."

"Of course! Of course!" Agassiz said, very pleased.

So, Scudder naturally asked what he should do next, and Agassiz said, "Look at your fish."

This episode came to mind as we are penetrating the Advent and Christmas season, a time of special decorations and festive hymns, holiday parties and presents, decorated trees and frosted cookies. Some items are venerated for their history; my maternal grandmother gave our family a hand carved German Nativity set, and we fondly remember her when we take the pieces out of the box and place them on the mantle. But if your house is anything like mine, the decorations, once dusted off, are placed exactly where they had been the year before.

Our well-worn traditions and our many seasonal activities can very easily overwhelm our ability to contemplate Jesus, whom we are celebrating. As the old bumper sticker used to say: "Jesus is the Reason for the Season." So, don't forget to look at your Jesus. There is the possibility that you will see how much you have not seen before, even though it has been right before your eyes all along.
