QUOTES ON COURAGE & BRAVERY

Mary Oliver, one of our best poets, asks a provocative question: "What is it you plan to do with your one wild and precious life?" It is a very good question even for those of us with less days to go than we have already lived. To answer it you have to believe that your life is both wild and precious. Most of us consider ourselves pretty ordinary.

Another poet, Marianne Williamson, puts it this way:

Our deepest fear is not that we are inadequate,

Our deepest fear is that we are powerful beyond measure.

It is our light, not our darkness, that most frightens us.

We ask ourselves, who am I to be brilliant, gorgeous, talented, and fabulous—

Actually, who are you not to be?

You are a child of God.

Your playing small doesn't serve the world.

There is nothing enlightened about shrinking so that other people

Won't feel insecure around you.

We are born to make manifest the glory of God within us.

It is not just in some of us: it is everyone,

And as we let our own light shine, we unconsciously

Give other people permission to do the same.

As we are liberated from our own fear, our presence automatically liberates others.

Walter Burghardt SJ reminds us that "Courage is not the absence of fear. It is feeling afraid to do something but finding the strength to do it. For courage, reach. Reach into your deepest self and dare to discover the surprise found by a woman living with cancer: 'The more courage I used to get through the day, the more courage I had. The more I embraced life—relationships, nature and the joys of everyday life—the richer my life became.'"

Madeleine L'Engle, the author of A *Wrinkle in Time*, puts it another way: "We have to be braver than we think we can be, because God is constantly calling us to be more than we are."



SPREAD THE WORD—NOT THE FLU

Staying healthy physically is a very important part of



our spiritual well-being. The sign of peace and communion are integral parts of the Catholic mass, but these traditions can come at a cost in flu season. For the duration of flu

season, be considerate and be proactive about taking care of your health with these suggestions:

- -Get a flu vaccine, it isn't too late.
- —During flu season wash your hands more than usual and avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.
- —In Christian charity, those who aren't feeling well should not attend Mass, and return to church only when they are well. The obligation to attend Mass does not apply to those who are sick.
- —During the Sign of Peace, instead of a handshake, make a simple gesture such as a smile or a bow of the head with the words "Peace be with you" to show the mutual charity celebrated in this part of the liturgy. Our church is currently suspending the distribution of the Precious Blood at Mass. Also, our Holy water fonts are being drained and re-filled regularly. We pray for the health and recovery of all who are ill and not with us today.



BLESSING OF THROATS

On February 3rd, the feast day of St. Blaise, those who wish to receive the Blessing of the Throats will be invited to stay after mass and come forward. St. Blaise was a bishop in Armenia during the 4th century. The first known record of the saint's life comes where he is recorded as helping with patients suffering from objects stuck in their throat. In 316 the governor of Lesser Armenia, Agricola, arrested Bishop Blaise for being a Christian. On their way to the jail, a woman set her only son, who was chocking to death on a fish bone, at his feet. Blaise cured the child. Agricola was amazed but when he could not get Blaise to renounce his faith, he beat Blaise with a stick and tore his flesh before beheading him.

In another tale, Blaise was being led to prison, and on the way came across a poor old woman whose pig had been stolen by a wolf. Blaise commanded the wolf return the pig, which it did (alive and uninjured) to the amazement of all. When he reached prison, the woman came to him and brought two fine wax candles in an attempt to dispel the gloom of his darkened cell. St. Blaise is often depicted holding two crossed candles in his hand.
