

BEHEADED MARTYRS OF FEBRUARY, PART 2

The 14th of this month will be Valentine's Day. People will give their loved ones gifts of chocolate, flowers and sometimes even jewels. Young people will ask others if they will be their "Valentines." A lot of couples will go out to eat a romantic meal that evening.

Tradition has it that St. Valentine died on this day in Rome in 278 A.D., having been beaten to death with clubs and then beheaded. His crime was said to be that he secretly married couples. Let me explain: Under Emperor Claudius, Rome carried out many unpopular and bloody campaigns and the emperor was having trouble raising enough soldiers. Claudius believed that Roman men preferred to stay at home because of their strong attachment to their spouses and children. So, he banned all marriages and engagements. When it was discovered that Valentine had defied Claudius and was witnessing the marriages of couples anyway, he was condemned to death. Legend has it that while he was in prison, he prayed over the jailer's blind daughter and her sight was restored; Valentine left a farewell note to her whom he had befriended and signed it "From your Valentine."

Romans used to have a pagan festival of love called Lupercalia on the 15th of February. The names of young women were placed in a box where the young men picked one out of the box by chance. Then each young man and woman would date for the coming year: Speed-dating in slow motion. In 496 A.D., Pope Gelasius put an end to that feast while at the same time establishing the feast of St. Valentine on the 14th of February. That may explain how Valentine got so associated with things romantic.





FAITH FORMATION

Every year we complete a census for our Diocese on Faith Formation programs in our parish. Here are a few facts about our elementary/junior high programs:

- Our classes meet Sundays, Mondays, and Tuesdays accommodating the 79 students/60 parish families enrolled.
- Eight volunteer catechists cheerfully give their time each week assisted by two volunteer classroom aides.
- We also rely on four terrific volunteer substitute teachers.
- We prepare students for the sacraments and more. After First Communion, we offer curriculum that helps our students to grow in knowledge of their faith, in the love of Jesus, and in fellowship with other Catholic children through 8th grade.
- We offer Children's Liturgy of the Word during the 10:00 a.m. mass on Sunday! Children from age 4 through age 12 receive the mass readings at their age-level in Room 1 and then rejoin parents in the family pew for the second half of mass.

Confirmation: Students typically begin the Confirmation process as a freshman in high school and complete the process at the end of their sophomore year.

Marriage: An appointment with one of our priests to begin marriage preparation must be made at least 6 months before the wedding celebration.
