FATHER BEN TRAN

This weekend we thank Father Ben for his four years of service here at Saint Anne's; it seems only yesterday that he came among us.

St John Paul II called on priests to be "heralds of the Gospel who are experts in humanity [and] who have shared to the full the joys and sorrows of our day, but who at the same time are contemplatives in love with God." Fr. Ben loved to preach the Gospel but always from the depths of his own life and prayer among us. It is obvious he loves God and that he likes being among us too. He is no hermit.

An old monk once told a man just before his ordination, "You're taking a tremendous gamble offering your life to God as a priest. And God is taking an even bigger gamble accepting you. You're just going to have to trust one another." I like that advice. When each of us were in the seminary preparing for ordination, we had the arrogance of inexperience: we thought we knew what being a priest was going to be like. We had hung around priests, studied under priests and many of us had friends who were priests. But once we got ordained, our lives turned out to actually be very different that what we had imagined. (I suspect married couples may have similar experiences.)

Priestly ministry is interactive. We start out by trying to change the minds and hearts of our parishioners by

what we say and do. That's our ministry. That's why we studied many years in the seminary and continue our education after ordination. We are committed to



serve you as well as possible. But it also works the other way: our minds and hearts are changed by our encounters with our parishioners. So, on behalf of Fr. Ben, I want to thank you, our parishioners, for how you have shaped and stretched and inspired and irrevocably changed Fr. Ben, not to mention myself, Fr. Bob and Fr. Edward. It is a great gift that you give generously. Fr. Ben leaves a transformed person and priest because of you.

Once, when talking to priests, Pope Benedict described the work of parish priests as something they share together: "Today we have cars which make traveling easier so that we can experience being together ever anew, learn from one another, mutually correct and help one another, cheer one another and comfort one another, so that in this communion of the presbyterate, together with the bishop, we can carry out our service to the local Church." If I know anything about Fr. Ben, he'll be back to visit often enough.

Next Sunday Father Timothy Nguyen will be here introducing himself.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION


Processions are life's journey distilled. We move with companions, aware that Christ accompanies us, as we move to the altar for Communion or to the font for baptism, or carry a loved one to a place of rest. In Europe, the season of pilgrimage is beginning now, and tens of thousands of people are moving by foot on well-worn paths. Some take as long as six weeks to walk the last few hundred miles of the medieval pilgrimage route to the Shrine of St. James the Apostle in Compostella, in northern Spain.

Those who make the journey by foot, hiking, or by bicycle, have a kind of passport stamped at villages and monasteries on the road. When they present this document at the cathedral, they are given the emblem of a pilgrim, the scallop shell of St. James. High over their heads at Mass, a huge *botafumero* twirls clouds of sweet incense through the cathedral. Cynics say it is to mask the odor of smelly feet. The pilgrims know better. Seeing through the clouds the happy faces of those they met along the road, they recognize a foretaste of the welcome into heaven, and the joy of meeting loved ones in the Kingdom of God.
