HE POURS OUT HIS SPIRIT WITHOUT STINT

Saint Cyprian is important in the development of Christian thought and practice in the third century, especially in northern Africa. Highly educated, a famous orator, he became a Christian as an adult. He distributed his goods to the poor, and amazed his fellow citizens by making a vow of chastity before his baptism. Within two years he had been ordained a priest and was chosen, against his will, as Bishop of Carthage. Here he gives his witness:



promised to share with you the grace God in his great mercy has shown me, and to tell you as simply as I can what I have experienced since I was baptized.

Until that time I was still living in the dark, knowing nothing of my true life. I was completely involved in this world's affairs. I had indeed been told that God offered men and women a second birth by which we could be saved, but I very much doubted that I could change the kind of life I was then living. How is it possible, I asked myself, to change the habits of a life-time instantaneously? How can one suddenly rid one-self of accumulated guilt and break with sin that has become so deeply rooted in one's life? Is every species of temptation suddenly to lose its force?

These were my thoughts. My past life was burdened with so many sins that I saw no way ever to be rid of, that I had grown accustomed to giving way to my weakness. I simply humored my evil inclinations and made no attempt to combat them.

But at last I made up my mind to ask for baptism. I went down into those life-giving waters, and all the stains of my past were washed away. I committed my life to the Lord; he cleansed my heart and filled me with his Holy Spirit. I was born again, a new [person]. I could now see what had been hidden from me before, I found that I could do things that had previously been impossible. By living according to my new birth in the Holy Spirit I had already begun to share God's eternal life.

All our power for good is God's gift; he is the source of our life and strength. Through him we grow and mature, so as to experience even in this life a foretaste of what is to come.

If we walk firmly and steadily in the Lord's ways, trusting in him with all our heart and strength all we have to do is to be what our baptism has made us. God does

not measure his heavenly gift to us; he pours out his Spirit without stint, so that it flows freely on and on, never ceasing, continually abounding in endless generosity. We have only to open our hearts with longing and drink it in....

When I look back on the darkness from which I have escaped, I can only praise and thank God for the love he has shown me....

When we have been admitted to a share in the divine gift and have come to know the Lord, we discover that the things that seem so important to others are as nothing compared to the joy we now experience.

When we see what we once were, it makes us love even more what we are to be.

We do not have to toil and sweat to achieve our own perfection, nor are money and influence needed to obtain the gift of the Holy Spirit. It is freely given by God, always available for us to use. Just as the sun shines and the day brings light, the stream irrigates the soil and rain waters the earth, so the heavenly Spirit pours itself into us.

We have received the seal of the Spirit. Our task now is to preserve the integrity of what we have received by living a truly Christian life. We must give time to prayer and the study of scripture, now speaking to God, now listening to his word and letting his teaching mold us. He has enriched us with a treasure no one can take away; we have eaten and drunk at his heavenly banquet, and can never again know the pinch of poverty, until the day our bodies are restored to us from the grave and our whole being is brought to the perfect realization of God's plan for us.
