

THE CALL

There's got to be more to it than what Saint Mark tells us in his Gospel. Simon and his brother were casting their nets into the Sea of Galilee when Jesus said, "Come after me and I will make you fishers of men." Right then and there the two followed Jesus. Mark's gospel includes no conversation among them, no questions from the disciples; he has written down nothing but the call.

Jesus then ran into James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother James; he also called them and they immediately left their Father in the boat with the hired men and went with Jesus. What was so compelling? After all, the fishermen seemed to be successful; Zebedee and his sons were doing well enough to hire workmen to help them. Why would they set that aside?

The obvious explanation is that all these men were neighbors around the Sea. They already knew each other. I would not be surprised if Jesus had gone out fishing with them from time to time; he certainly knew a lot about the art of fishing. But it must also have been true that the disciples had already known a lot about Jesus and his spirituality. They had been given the basics by Jesus in neighborhood conversation and perhaps in the give-and-take of synagogue services.

A little while later, something similar happens again. Along the sea, a crowd gathered around Jesus and his disciples. Jesus saw someone he obviously already knew, Levi, son of Alphaeus, sitting in his custom's post. Jesus called him to follow him, which he did. Apparently where Jesus led Levi and the others was to Levi's own house where the whole crowd was going to be fed. The scribes and the Pharisees were dismayed to find themselves dining with sinners and tax collectors but Jesus explained that he came to save all sinners and so all were welcome. The Pharisees were unlikely swayed; sinners are sinners and the Pharisees did not consider themselves sinners in need of saving and apparently neither did the learned scribes.

Luke's Gospel gives a clearer sense of discernment.

Upon a mountain Jesus spent a night in prayer; in the morning he came down and chose twelve from among his disciples to serve as apostles. But Jesus selected Judas Iscariot as one of the twelve, which obviously was a mistake. Luke clearly identifies him as the one "who became a traitor."

We incorrectly think of a "call" as a once in a lifetime

moment. Rather, if it is allowed to, a call grows into an ongoing relationship in which further calls may be discovered.

St. Mother Teresa was a Sister of Loreto, until she was called to leave the Loreto Sisters and found the Missionaries of Charity.

St. Elizabeth Ann Bayley Seaton distinguished herself in New York by founding "The Society for the

Relief of Poor Widows with Small Children." After her experiences in Italy, she became a Catholic, which led her to be shunned by many of her peers in respectable society. Having lost her husband, she found it difficult to care for herself and her five children. Despite that, she ran a school for boys, then a larger school for girls, and in the end she was able to found a community of religious women, the Sisters of St. Joseph, the first America-based religious community. In Emmetsburg, Maryland, she and her community were able to offer free education to the girls of the parish, the beginning of what became the parochial school system.

It's worth praying about one's own call from time to time. Like St. Elizabeth, sometimes a trip can deepen one's calling. At other time it is a thoughtful conversation with a friend or even a stranger, or reading a compelling book, even seeing a stirring play or movie. Like Mother Teresa, it can be the direct contact with the suffering poor and dying; others walked around the dying as they went about their daily affairs; Mother Teresa saw them and realized that they were the people to whom she had been called.
