

Behold! An elderly woman is pouring tea for her husband, as she does every day. Her hands shake and some of the tea is spilt into the saucer but she pours with such simplicity that it is but one brief episode of a lifetime of millions of loving gestures.

A man comes sweating from his garden, tomatoes, lettuce, cucumbers and onions gathered in his arms, an expressions of triumph on his face as he presents his bounty to the people already sitting at the table and waiting.



An ungainly child, trying to learn how to ride a bike, suddenly gets her balance. She pedals faster and turns gracefully in the driveway, showing off to her brother that she is doing it: riding her bike like a big kid.

A father and son are sitting on the patio. The conversation starts by the boy's description of a momentous play he was part of in a baseball game earlier in the day. But then the two of them are talking about why they really love baseball and the games they remember witnessing or

playing in over time.

With advice from her grandmother, a twelve year old girl, following her mother's recipe, puts together the ingredients for a pie filling, puts it into a pie-crust and watches it with wonder as it cooks in the oven, a triumph she will proudly present at the end of dinner two hours later.

A new college student gets off a plane in a place he has only been briefly before. Miraculously his luggage arrives with him. Then finds the right contact and, within two hours, he is walking into his dorm room, anxious but also energized to enter the new world of college, the pleasure of making friends and the mission of learning all sorts of new things.
