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You may already have made a list of your new year's resolutions but just in case you haven't, let me offer a few suggestions:

Listen. Too many of us pretend to listen or listen just enough to be able to figure out what we will say in response. As a confessor I have had to work at listening carefully so a penitent will know he or she has been heard. Parents, please note that children will keep saying the same things over and over until they know that you heard what they have to say. You can save yourself some grief by listening the first time.

Watch where you are going. Often I see people walking down Main Street who are lost in the screens of their smart phones, even crossing the street without looking up. The phone may be smart but they are not. The same can be said about drivers who are talking on their phones but not paying attention.

Say your prayers. Pray every day, and I'm not talking about grace at meals. Our lives are often action-packed from sun up to sun down, so we forget to say our prayers. For me, prayer is the second thing I do each morning. (The first is making coffee.) It is part of my routine and that's why it happens each day. By the way, I'm not sure God is impressed by long, rambling prayers, so don't go on and on; Jesus advised, "when you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words."

Gratitude. God's providence is ever-present but when we *notice* it, we ought to say thank you. I mean out loud. For example, you almost get in a traffic accident but don't. "Thank you, Lord." When you have bills you aren't sure you can afford to pay and, unexpectedly, a check comes in the mail, say, "Thank you, Lord."

You are headed for the checkout counter in the market but you see an item that you were also going to buy—say mustard—in another person's cart. As you turn back down the condiment aisle, remember to say "Thank you." (I doubt that God is that detail-oriented with regard to mustard but it could be a nudge from your guardian angel.)

Care for the Poor. Make it your practice to regularly give help to the poor. I have a hunch that when you face Saint Peter at the pearly gates, if he's not sure about letting you in, he'll then see a note in the big book that says you took care of the poor. That will count for a lot. I promise.

Don't Swear. If you are one of those people who swears at other drivers, give a buck to the poor every time you do. I guarantee you will soon break that bad habit.

Less Fast Food. Cut back on drive-thru fast food. When I lived in Italy, an Italian friend said to me, "I have never been to America but somebody who went there said that Americans buy their meals out the windows of restaurants and then eat them while driving in their cars. Is that true?" He thought it was uncivilized. (I make an exception for In-and-Out; their burgers and fries are so tasty!)

Lent. Consider going to Mass each day of Lent. The readings then are given for our conversion and going to communion every day increases the graces we all need. (But don't get obsessive about it; if you miss one or two, no worries. Just do the best you can.)

SALVATION IN DAILY LIFE

SAINT THOMAS BECKET


To anyone who imagines conflict between religion and politics to be a modern phenomenon, history witnesses otherwise. Martyred under Henry VIII in 1535, Thomas More



declared, "I die the king's good servant, but God's first!" Thomas Becket could have said the same four centuries earlier. As Henry II's closest friend and trusted chancellor, Becket, the king presumed, could be counted on, if made archbishop, to deliver the church to royal control. But Becket experienced a profound conversion, confirmed by the ordination liturgy's rich symbolism of the bishop as Good Shepherd and the church as Bride of Christ. Renouncing secular responsibilities, distributing his wealth to the poor, Thomas became the church's uncompromising champion. Faced with this "new" Becket, the king's previous friendship turned into a ferocious, almost irrational hatred. As eight centuries later, Archbishop Romero would be martyred at the altar of Christ's sacrifice, Becket was slain before the altar of Canterbury Cathedral by royal agents, neither the first nor last good shepherd to lay down his life as the price of freedom for Christ's church and justice for Christ's sheep. –Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J.
