

ASH WEDNESDAY




s I mentioned last week, the original meaning of Lent was *ver sacrum*, holy spring.

The cross of ashes traced on your forehead on Wednesday is not only a reminder that you are dust

and to dust you shall return, but it is also a pledge of resurrection. Dust is not all there is to say about death. We believe in the resurrection of the body and so, in a way known only to God, even our bodies will be redeemed in the next life. Lent is a time to repent and believe more deeply in the Gospel.

It is ironic that when we receive ashes, the gospel assigned that day tells us to wash our faces and not look

gloomy when we fast. Our penances are not for show; they are practices by which we hope to deepen our spiritual lives both by confessing our sins and also by changing our bad habits. As Thomas Merton wrote, "It is a day, we shall see, in which joy and grief go together



indifference that can creep into our daily lives.

God's grace is rich during the season of Lent. We find healing in its silences. It is possible that we will recognize the sins we have not been fully aware of before, or grow in the grace of being in God's presence without always asking for something from him.

In keeping with Pope Francis' call for all of us to increase our knowledge of and devotion to the Sacred Scriptures, you might want to follow the readings that the Church has designated for each day of Lent. To find them, there are a number of Apps for that; I use IMissal. After reading the readings for a particular day, you might ask yourself: What in those readings most sounded like something I need to hear?

> As I mentioned last week, Lent lasts now forty days in keeping with the example of Jesus who went into the desert for forty days to prepare for the start of his ministry, and part of that was combatting the power of the Devil. Since we live in an increasingly secular

hand in hand: for that is the meaning of compunction a sorrow which pierces, which liberates, which gives hope and therefore joy."

Lent can be a time of casting out what cannot remain in the same room as mercy, casting out what impedes our way to reconciliation with those we are on bad terms with, casting out attitudes that cloud our minds with selfish desires and obsessing over what is not really that important in the long run, casting out the boredom and society, let's not let Lent slip by us as we drive to work, as we complete our normal chores, as we pay our taxes, shop for groceries and do the other stuff that demands our attention. For forty days, let us be a community of penitents, a community of those praying every day, alone and together, of those living a different life from what we usually live. God will notice.

LENT - FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Lent begins on February 26th with Ash Wednesday. The faithful are to do penance through prayer and fasting, abstinence and by exercising works of piety and charity. Abstinence: All who have reached their 14th birthday are to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent. Fasting: All those who are 18 or older, until their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Only one full meal is allowed on days of fast. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's need; but together, they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. The obligation does not apply to those whose health or ability to work would be affected seriously.
