WATCHING THE NEWS

I have been a news junkie since I became an adult. If circumstances prevent me on a particular day from watching the evening news when it is broadcast, I have a DVR that records the program for me, so I can watch it when I get home.

The news is not always good. The old saying, "If it bleeds, it leads," is still followed by reporters and anchors. The BBC news has cameramen who seem to get themselves into the very middle of the action more often than the others. It is a wonder they have not

themselves been injured or killed.

Recently the fighting in Syria has been particularly gruesome. Planes drop their bombs on neighborhoods, blowing up houses and killing or injuring the people who have not been able to

not been able to flee to a neighboring country. UN Secretary General António Guterres says the estimated 390,000 people trapped there are "living in a hell on earth", forced to shelter from the bombardment in overcrowded basements where access to food, water and sanitation is limited.

I see video of men running with wounded children in their arms. The camera turns and there is a dead body in the street. It swings up and you see a progovernment plane flying over, dropping more bombs. The little children, too young to understand what is happening or why, look out with disbelief. Why would someone do this to me? Who wanted to kill my playmate? Why?

I am tempted to change the channel or go out into the kitchen and pour myself a scotch. I see these scenes almost every night on the news. It is depressing. But then I remember that if it is depressing for me to see these scenes, think of what it must be like to be a young child in these circumstances day after day, for weeks at a time. What must it be like to grow up in such a place? How many family members have been lost or wounded? Our children here in Seal Beach are playing sports or doing their homework or

listening to music on their headphones while these children are hiding in a basement hoping the bombs do not fall on them.

Knowing specifically how people are suffering each day I take to be a kind of spiritual responsibility. When I pray for peace, I have

images in my head of those I hope will be given that peace, those small children, their terrified parents, neighbors and the courageous emergency workers. Though I can't do anything to stop the war, I can still witness it. I can know that these strangers are suffering and some of them are dying. I can pray for them and their peace.

I live a comfortable life. So do most of you. When the news reported is about partisan politics, I want to give up in disgust. But I keep watching each day because I want to know how the children are doing. I keep hoping I will hear news of their peace and healing.

It is important for children to be enrolled and remain in faith formation classes learning about their Catholic faith. Each year is a spiral curriculum that builds on the previous year. Faith formation classes equip your child to navigate their world with good values, strong morals, and discipleship. What children learn each year:

PreK and Kindergarten: Learning about God and Jesus and how much they love us.

Grade 1: Understanding basic prayers, becoming aware of their behavior and how it affects others. (This is the first year of the 2-year commitment to receive First Communion).

Grade 2: Preparation for the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion.

Grade 3: Understanding the Apostle's Creed, history and theology.

Grade 4: Unpacking the rich tradition of the 10 commandments; this is the basis for examining their conscience as adults.

Grade 5: The sacraments, what they are, why they were given to us, and how they work in our lives.

Grade 6: Overview of the bible, old testament and prophets in detail, how we are God's people Grade 7/8: Living our faith, understanding our behavior and calling as disciples and members of the church. Preparation for Confirmation, making adult choices, and living moral lives.
