BEAUTY

The playwright, Jean Kerr, once observed, "I'm tired of all this nonsense about beauty being only skin deep. That's deep enough. What do you want, an adorable pancreas?" I'm with her. They also say that beauty is in the eye of the beholder, but I don't buy that. Some people tastes tend toward the sentimental and the cute; what would please them, I probably would not call beautiful.

I remember the first time I visited the Museum of Modern Art in New York City; I was with my folks and a friend. My folks were starting to make noises about going to lunch, so my friend and I were walking through the galleries rather quickly, not wanting to miss any of the famous paintings there that we had seen in textbooks but never in person. Then we came around a corner into a new gallery and were confronted with a painting so beautiful, it stopped us dead in our tracks. This painting's beauty demanded contemplation. We could not rush by this one, no, we could not.

A few weeks ago, I was reading an article in magazine in which a photographer described how he had taken a photo of a Russian woman who was 101 years old and who was holding a photograph of her husband who had died in the Russian revolution seventy years earlier. It was obvious she loved him still, though he had been long gone. She was beautiful, and the photograph of her holding the framed photo of her husband was also beautiful.

Isn't it beautiful when an individual or a group are absorbed in doing something they obviously love? Something beautiful comes across the face of a child captivated by what he or she is reading. Dancers are taken by the music they hear and each other. Basketball players who, after all their practice, now move down the court as if they were one body, none hardly having to think of where their team mates are; teamwork like that can be beautiful, unless it belongs to a team other than yours. Sometimes at a Farmer's Market, you will come across a tomato that is beautifully and perfectly ripe. It is firm but not hard; the red of it is lush, not salmon, like the ones you see in the reg-

ular market. You want to eat it right there, like an apple.

When I used to do my homework early in the morning before I went to school, I would turn on the television to keep me company. In those days at that early hour what was on TV were university level classes. One was about Russian literature, which I didn't pay much attention to, but I did learn the proper pronunciation of the names of writers like Pushkin and Dostoevsky. Another was about painting; the professor had all of these shapes layered over the paintings, showing which (circle, square, rectangle, triangle) went into the picture's pleasing layout. He was trying to tell us *why* a certain painting was beautiful. I thought that was a lot of hooey; you didn't have to know a lot of high brow information to know if a painting was beautiful; it is something one intuitively knows. My mother came in to start the coffee and asked me who I had been talking to. "This guy on the television doesn't know what he's talking about, making paintings so complicated."

Looking over her shoulder briefly, she turned back to the coffee maker but said, "Get your homework done first. Then fight with the professor."

I had once been up all night because of a very long Easter vigil ceremony, leaving only an hour or so until I had to be over at the church for the early Mass. So I decided to go to the beach. Already there were a couple of surfers in the water when I got there. Not many minutes after that, the sky behind me had the slightest glow. I waited for the next, brighter glow which came quickly enough. Still very tired, I was also enchanted by the building radiance, the ocean itself now beginning to catch the dawning light. When it completely arrived, I went back to the church, which I did with a sense that I had seen the resurrection. When we find ourselves in beautiful places, we feel at home, not because we own them (most of the time we don't) but because we feel most alive within them.

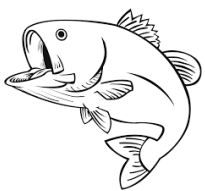
KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

MARRIAGE ENCOUNTER

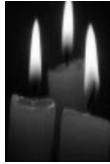
