

COMMUNION

Years ago, a classmate of mine had a mother who was dying of cancer. He had been visiting her in the hospital as much as he could. On one of his visits his mother told him that a short nun had been coming to visit her every day and she was greatly comforted by that. This struck him as odd, so he asked her what the nun's name was. She told him, but he did not recognize it, though he thought he knew all the religious who were

living in this rural locale. He didn't think anything about it again until he ran into that same name in the Catholic newspaper; the Vatican had recently declared a nun by that name a saint. There was a picture and, sure enough, she was short. It must be a coincidence, he thought. There are a lot of short nuns in the world. By then his mother had died and been buried so there was no going back to her to check. He asked at the hospital the next time he went to anoint a patient but none of the staff could recall having heard of or seen any nuns. The reason my classmate told me this story was because he didn't know what to make of it. Had a saint chosen his mother as her special charge? Or had his mother's pain medication given her hallucinations? Had someone told her about the new saint? Short of heaven, there was no way to know.

We speak of "eternal rest" when we

pray for the dead. I imagine the saints sitting comfortably in heaven on very nicely upholstered sofas, perhaps done in a brocade. Struggle and drudgery belong here on earth; in heaven every day should be a holiday.

Yet I am not so sure that's really the way it works. Think of Mother Teresa of Calcutta, someone we know well who is now in heaven. Do you think she would be content to sit around? No, she'd be bored to tears. I think of my parents. On a lovely evening, particularly in Summer, they enjoyed sitting out of the back patio, having their drinks, smoking their cigarettes and talking about those things that adults talked about, subjects that bored us kids to death, but during the day they both worked very hard. Doing crossword puzzles for all eternity would not be enough to occupy my mom, though she was very good at them when

> she was alive. She even did them in ink! My father was a wiz with an adding machine, totaling a long list of numbers without ever looking up from the page, so if he is still looking for an interesting challenge in heaven, perhaps he'll receive a post in the Creator's workshop calculating the half-life of galaxies.

> So now I am considering various eternal options. Up there, people will no longer need me to say Masses or distribute the sacraments, so maybe I could go back and improve my piano playing. Likely there are people who would be interested in a sing-along. There are many books that I will not yet have read. But I imagine—at least for the first part of my time in heaven— I'll busy myself with praying for and encouraging those I knew and loved who are still on earth: members of my family, parishioners and friends. No doubt I will be missing them and so I

would do so to make sure that they lived their lives in ways that would make it possible for them to join me in heaven. But if my classmate's story is true and heavenly bodies can be assigned to various earthly bodies, I would be honored to attend to someone who was dying or facing a divorce or has had a nervous breakdown. People in those circumstances deserve their own saintly partner. That would be a good job for me, don't you think? Msgr. Mike

WOMEN OF THE CHURCH

The Catholic Church produced many of the world's notable women scientists and scholars. Other Catholic women have risen to international prominence through charitable mission works and social justice campaigns. Scholars have recognized the Belgian nun, St Juliana of Liège (1193–1252) as the promoter of the Feast of Corpus Christi, first celebrated in Liège in 1246, and later adopted for the universal church in 1264.

From her early youth, Juliana had great veneration for the Eucharist and longed for a special feast day in its honor. Juliana was 16 when she had her first vision telling her to promote the Feast.

Around 1225, she was elected prioress of her local order and told her visions to her confessor who relayed Juliana's vision to distinguished religious leaders. These theologians unanimously agreed and endorsed instituting the Feast.

Juliana's life was filled with turmoil, a consequence of the religious and political controversies rampant in Liège. Persecuted, she left her order and found refuge in various communities where she lived in seclusion until her death.

In 1264, Pope Urban IV instituted the Solemnity of Corpus Christi on the Thursday after Pentecost as a feast for the Church and commissioned his chief theologian, Saint Thomas Aquinas, to compose an office for the Feast of Corpus Christi.

Juliana was canonized in 1869 by Pope Pius IX and mentioned by Pope John Paul II, in a letter on the 750th anniversary of the Feast of Corpus Christi. Juliana's visions help us to remember that Christ in the Eucharist is the center of our lives and connects us to each other, especially in troubled times.
