

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WIND IN THE BIBLE

n the first chapter of the first book of the Bible, we read, "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And a mighty wind was hovering over the face of the waters." Even before there was light, there was wind.

When the Holy Spirit was given to the apostles, the Spirit came in the form of a mighty wind: "When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting." Before the tongues of flame, the wind came first.

The prophet Elijah was told to "'Go out and stand on the mount before the LORD.' And behold, the LORD passed by, and a great and strong wind tore the mountains and broke in pieces the rocks before the LORD, but the LORD was not in the wind. And after the wind an earthquake, but the LORD was not in the earthquake." Rather the LORD was found in "a light silent sound," whatever that means. How can it be silent and a sound at the same time? So, it is not always the Lord who in the wind.

When earlier Moses stretched out his staff over the land of Egypt, and the LORD brought an east wind upon the land all that day and all that night. When it was morning, the east wind had brought the locusts." The wind as bearer of a plague.

By contrast the LORD turned "the wind into a very strong west wind, which lifted the locusts and drove them into the Red Sea. Not a single locust was left in all the country of Egypt." The wind delivers the people from a plague.

Later, when the people of Israel were in the desert, "a wind from the LORD sprang up, and it brought quail from the sea and let them fall beside the camp, about a day's journey on this side and a day's journey on the other side, around the camp, and about two cubits above the ground." This time the Lord's wind brought them the food they craved in the wilderness.

In the book of Jonah, we read that "the LORD hurled a great wind upon the sea, and there was a mighty tempest on the sea, so that the ship threatened to break up." Jonah should have known better than to try to go in the opposite direction of where the Lord had directed him.

When Jeremiah wanted a metaphor for the power of God, he turned to nature, including the wind: "When he utters his voice, there is a tumult of waters in the heavens, and he makes the mist rise from the ends of the earth. He makes lightning for the rain, and he brings forth the wind from his storehouses." I love the notion that God has a big storehouse of wind which he opens up and brings out when he wants to make his point.

St. James, on the other hand, said that the person who "doubts is like a wave of the sea that is driven and tossed by the wind." Without strong faith, the disciple is in danger. In one of his parables, Jesus said, "And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock." Jesus too underscored how we should pray for strong, enduring faith.

Sleeping in a boat but awakened by a big storm, Jesus "rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Peace! Be still!' And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm. He said to them, 'Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?' And they were filled with great fear and said to one another, 'Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?'" Jesus as the Lord of nature.

At the end of time, on the day of judgment, God "will send out his angels with a loud trumpet call, and they will gather his elect from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other." The wind is a fact of life and an expression of God's power. It will be with us to the very end.
