SAINT FRANCIS OF ASSISI

What is well known about Saint Francis of Assisi is that he started out as the son of a wealthy merchant but lived a life of poverty, gathering together like-minded men into what would become the Franciscan order. Also he preached to the birds and tamed a wolf that had been attacking people. But here are some things you may not know about the saint whose feast we celebrated last Friday, October 4th.

Francis' father, Pietro Bernardone, was enamored with all things French. In fact, he was in France when his son was born. His mother had their son baptized Giovanni after John the Baptist. Pietro was furious when he found out. He changed his name to Francesco because he wanted his son to reflect his own infatuation with France. His name meant French man.

In his youth Francis was not focused on holiness; he wanted to be a noble. Battle was the place in which he thought he could distinguish himself. At that time Assisi declared war on their long-time enemy, Perugia. The soldiers of Assisi were butchered. Francis seems to have survived because his father was rich and the Perugians knew they could demand a ransom for his release. It took a year but he was released.

The glory of battle was still on his mind when the call went out for knights to join the Fourth Crusade. Francis had a fancy suit of armor made decorated with gold, purchased a horse and a magnificent cloak to wear with his armor. Just one day on his way to the crusade, God told him in a dream that he had it all wrong and should return home, which he did. Not only had he not made it into battle but he was humiliated, laughed at and called a coward. His father was not pleased about how much money was wasted on the armor.

Only then did Francis start spending time in prayer; he went to a cave and wept over his sins. Slowly he was opening himself up to God's grace. A man who was

repulsed by deformity in any form suddenly faced a leper in the middle of the road. He jumped down from his horse and kissed the hand of the leper. When his kiss of peace was returned, Francis was filled with joy. As he rode off, he turned around and saw that the leper was gone. He realized that the encounter was a test from God and that he had passed it.



After that Francis began repairing the ancient church at San Damiano. Francis took fabric from his father's shop and sold it to get the money he needed to repair the church. When his father found out about the theft, he demanded that Francis return the money and renounce his rights as an heir. That led to the famous incident when Francis took off his clothes, gave them to his father, saying "Pietro Bernardone is no longer my father. From now on I can say freely, 'Our Father who art in heaven.'"

He began preaching, and that gathered a band of young men around him who wanted to know how they should live. Francis found three passages that gave them direction: Jesus telling the rich young man to sell all his goods and give to the poor; Jesus telling his disciples to take nothing for the journey when they were sent out as missionaries; and Jesus' demand that they take up the cross daily.

During the Fifth Crusade, Francis and a few companions went to Syria to convert the Moslems. He found his way to the Sultan to make peace. The Sultan was charmed by Francis and what he had to say. He replied, "I would convert to your religion, which is a beautiful one, but both of us would be murdered."

Years of poverty and a life of wandering led to illness for Francis. He was going blind but during this time he wrote his Canticle to the Sun about his brotherhood with creation in praising God. He was filled with joy to the very last day of his life. Msgr. Mike

BISHOPS' GOLF TOURNAMENT

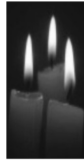
