HALLOWEEN

When you get right down to it, “trick or treating” is a form of extortion. You knock on someone’s door and, when they answer, you tell them, “Trick or treat,” meaning that if you don’t give me something good, I’m going to do something “tricky” to you, and I don’t mean magic. To get away with this shakedown, you dress up in various costumes so the one being extorted doesn’t know who you are. No chance for a police report. And we teach our kids to do this! What are we thinking? We also teach our kids not to talk to strangers but on that night they knock on strangers’ doors hoping to increase their take of candy and cookies. (A word to the wise: my long standing opinion has been that chocolate is best as a treat; remember, cookies easily crack making a mess of your pillowcase, leaving the cookie in many tiny pieces inside.)

Of course, there is another way to look at this: Children often wonder about who they will be when they grow up. At Halloween they get a chance to try out various possible identities: a princess, a ballerina, a soldier, a cowboy. Children are experts in pretend. Pretend expands the imagination and is a nutritious

form of play. Somehow, that is often lost in adults. Pity.

On the same day as our Halloween, the ancient Celts had a feast they called, Samhain, during which they lit bonfires and wore costumes to ward off ghosts. In the eighth century, Pope Gregory III designated November 1st as a feast of all the saints. In time the costumes and the bonfires of Samhain got incorporated into what became Halloween (meaning the vigil

of the feast of All Saints.) (Another word to the wise: Do not start a bonfire on your front lawn; the Orange County Fire Authority will thank you. Flashlights and sweaters will give you all the light and warmth you need.)

Maybe the problem is not with Halloween but with our culture. Too often neighbors don’t know one another. You just nod at them politely when you are going out and then on to your errands. That’s a pity. Let’s think of Halloween as a chance to get to know our neighbors by means of chocolate.




