EXPERIENCE II

Experience is not just personal; we do not simply create a life in our own image and likeness. Well, narcissists sometimes do. Rather, experience is collective. Think of life as a large library in which we experience many things: insights derived from the many books we sit down and read, of course, but also by the quiet conver-

sations we have with the others in the library, by the questions we ask each other which often bring us to a consensus about what's going on. In

going on. In this life we should never be bored.

When I was in my twenties, I thought I knew a lot, and I was in a big hurry to communicate what I knew to others. But those I talked to were not always convinced by what I had to say. They asked me questions or disagreed with what I had said. I defensively believed they were simply ignorant; I had already thought the whole thing out and my conclusions were definitive, whether it be about which peanut butter to buy or the nature of divine revelation. As you can imagine, I was not an engaging conversationalist; blowhards never are.

Nowadays I am much more inclined to listen. My favorite part of the day is when someone is telling me about his or her life, or explaining why the ocean is sometimes blue, and sometimes green and sometimes brown. These conversations reveal to me much more than I had known previously. They peek my curiosity

and stretch me.

Deep down, we humans have a common core, I believe, but our differences what fascinates. A graduate tells me a bit about how he was changed by the experience of studying chemistry in college, and his experi-

ence studying chemistry has little in common with my experience in the college seminary. A chef is poetic about the pleasure she has in cooking, not just in

pleasing others with her recipes but by the flavors and textures themselves; listening to her, I can almost smell the aromas.

For this reason I am glad I did not become a cloistered monk, no matter how much I admired Thomas Merton. I would surely have become bored living in an enclave with just the same group of men and few others. As a parish priest over the years, as I was moved from assignment to assignment, I met folks of every class, ethnic group and temperament. I like the variety.

This week the Dominican Cornelius Ernst is given the last word: "I cannot allow that God can only be adored in spirit and in truth by the individual introverted upon himself and detached from all that might disturb and solicit his heart. It must be possible to find and adore God in the complexity of human experience."
