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EMPATHETIC OPENNESS

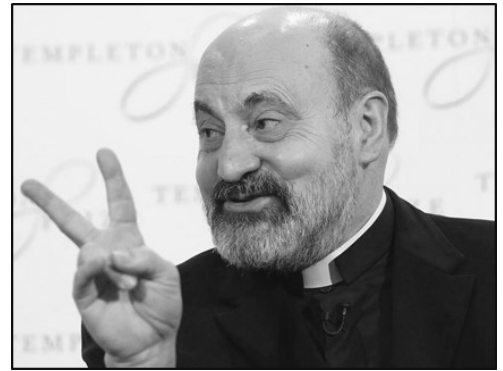
Msgr. Tomáš Halík is a parish priest and author in the Czech Republic. I was reading an English translation of his latest book recently and was confronted by this line: “The openness of the human heart and the openness of the Kingdom of God are one and the same openness.”

As we draw near to the feast of the Incarnation, what we contemplate is the Son of God as a tender newborn. We think back to the openness that Mary had to the message announced to her by the angel Gabriel. “May it be done unto me according to your word,” she said. When invited, nearby shepherds go to see this baby and congratulate the new mother; this comes as no surprise, as what else do they have to do on a cold night? I suspect they brought their sheep with them in order to continue to protect them against any hungry predators prowling in the fields. I wonder how Jesus reacted to all those sheep, “Baa, baa, baa, baa...”

Many years later Jesus, after asking for John's baptism and coming out of the waters, is told, “You are my beloved Son; with you I am pleased.” According to St. Mark's gospel, Jesus then immediately announced that the kingdom of God was at hand for all who were open to hearing the gospel by repenting. Those that were open to the kingdom of God came out to hear him preach on the hills and plains of Galilee. When the scribes and the Pharisees finally came out to see him, they were only watching for Jesus to make a mistake, to utter the wrong thing, to break the Law, so he could be condemned, which they will ultimately accomplish at a later date in Jerusalem.

Attitude is important. If you are not looking for anything, you certainly won't find anything. People who could have become your good friends will have to look for others to get to know. Ideas will be passed over

because you already judge them to be wrong. You'd be a lousy artist or scientist because you will have no inspiration. It's always the same old thing.

The novelist, Colum McCann, has another word for this needed openness: “The only true way to expand your world is to inhabit an otherness beyond yourselves. There is one simple word for this: empathy. Don't let them fool you. Empathy is violent. Empathy is tough. Empathy can rip you open. Once you go there, you can be changed.”

We settle for the same old, same old, because we are not inclined to change; we like ourselves just the way we are, if you don't mind. I'm fine.

One person can be too open and another can be not open enough. Where's the middle ground? Pope Francis draws the line for us: “True openness involves remaining steadfast in one's deepest convictions, clear and joyful in one's own identity, while at the same time being 'open to understanding those of the other party' and 'knowing that dialogue can enrich each side.'”

Dynamic Faith

REASON TO REJOICE

Dark violet is used throughout Advent to express its character as a season of spiritual preparation for Christmas and “the coming of the Lord.” But on the Third Sunday of Advent, formerly known as *Gaudete* (Latin for “rejoice”) Sunday, rose may be added to the liturgical environment. The entire liturgy is infused with a spirit of rejoicing.

Today’s first reading and Gospel proclaim the reality of God’s saving work in our midst. Isaiah exuberantly describes the idyllic transformation of all creation as a result of God’s presence in the midst of the people.

In the Gospel, Jesus connects Isaiah’s prophecy with what is happening in his own ministry. In addition to the list of healings from Isaiah (the blind, the lame, lepers, and the deaf), Jesus’ presence brings two other reasons for rejoicing: “The dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them”

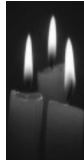
