

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IMAGINATION

In 1535 Saint Ignatius of Loyola had graduated from the University of Paris, the most prestigious place of learning in Europe at the time, and yet, it was not with his sophisticated intellect that he prayed but with his imagination. In the Exercises, he suggests that someone who wishes to contemplate the birth of Jesus should start with the journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem: "It will be here to see with the sight of the imagination the road from Nazareth to Bethlehem; considering the length and the breadth, and whether such road is level or through valleys or over hills; likewise looking at the place or cave of the Nativity. The place or cave of the Nativity is in the Saint's hand, correcting the inn, which is crossed out... how large, how small, how low, how high, and how it was prepared."

At times we mistakenly think that what's in our imagination is "made up," "not real," "stuff that doesn't really exist." "He's just imagining things," we say about a dreamer. But that is not how Einstein saw it, and in his day Einstein was one of the most sophisticated intellects around.

"Imagination is more important than knowledge. For knowledge is limited to all we now know and understand, while imagination embraces the entire world, and all there

ever will be to know and understand." Inventors and artists recognize this for what they know are the building blocks of what they can create: ideas and



feelings, plans and flow charts, blueprints and encyclopedias that take us where we have never been before. All it took for Isaac Newton was for an apple to fall from a tree and soon he had his new theory on the workings of gravity.

We suffer nowadays from what the Jesuit Adolfo Nicolás calls "the globalization of superficiality," which is the exhausting flow of triviality, fake news, alternative facts, false promises, the blare of commercials, the tedium of the 24 hour news

cycle, the inhuman effort we believe we must make to keep up with everything that captures our interest. This subverts our imagination, distracts us, and makes us less able to concentrate, to treasure a moment in silence or take in the quiet wisdom of someone who has something important to tell us. Imagination is worth protecting.


Colom McCann takes it farther; he recommends: "Take pleasure in the recklessness of your own imagination." Don't take as fashion what you see in a magazine. Don't agree to the kind of thinking that's called "common knowledge." Common can be a pejorative. Consider alternatives. Think things through. Make friends with those who you perceive as having some depth and listen to them. When all else fails, sit in silence and let your subconscious sort things out. In other words, take pleasure in the recklessness of your own imagination.

Yes, it isn't everything. A realm exists where "eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and it had not entered the human heart." Mystics like Meister Eckhart and Saint John of the Cross have told us about their experiences of the places where the imagination cannot reach. They did

not get there by rejecting thought and reflection but by going through the imaginative heart to the frontier of contemplation. They could never have anticipated such a place

and cannot on their own understand it. It is completely a gift from God, and what a gift it must be.
