GIVING THANKS

I have had more time for reading these days, like we all have. I am in the middle of two very interesting books. (It is my usual style to have at least a couple of books on my side table as I never am sure what mood I will be in when I sit down to read.)


The first is a work of fiction, based on facts around the real life friendship of a Palestinian and a Jew, who find themselves united by loss; it's Colum McCann's new novel, *Apeirogon*, named for a shape with a countably infinite number of sides. (I am not even sure how to pronounce the word.) You might remember McCann from his award winning best-seller, *Let the Great World Spin*, which among other things was the story of a tightrope walker who crossed between the two Trade Towers in New York and its effect on the people who witnessed him doing it. *Apeirogon* shows the many, many sides of life in the Middle East where Jews, Arabs and Christians, the fervent and the profane, share the same space and all the complications borne of such a society. I have been to the Holy Land twice in my life but I was a pilgrim both times, and pilgrims see and pray at the holy sites and listen to tour guides and preachers but rarely get a glimpse into the tensions of living daily life among such pressures in a small country the size of Delaware. I like the book so far but wonder where this story will take me next.

The other book I am reading is a book of essays by Thomas Lynch, who has written both poetry and nonfiction but is also a professional undertaker, a trade that, naturally leads to encounters with both the living and the dead. In the essay I read this morning, Lynch describes his alcoholism and that of his son. He is very candid in his description of his personal struggle and the pain he felt when he was not able to get his son to stop drinking. "Fix things: that is what a parent is supposed to be able to do." When he was drinking he was sometimes depressed, angry, blaming others for how he felt but there was always a reason to drink. If you are in mourning, let's drink to old so-and-so; but if things were going well, let's drink to celebrate our good

fortune. But after he stopped drinking, he began to feel thankful. "Every day begins with thanks."

Which got me thinking about our current circumstances. If you watch the news too much, either Fox or CNN, depending on your temperament, you can get fixated on what's wrong, what's dangerous, what isn't working, all the reasons to be anxious. You just want this pandemic to be over with so you can get back your "life"! Like you, I am restless, unsettled, and having strange, unpredictable sleep patterns. Which is why I am recommending to you the following part of an old Gaelic prayer. Say it every day to remind yourself of why you pray.


